The 23rd Annual C-HPP Symposium in Honor of Prof. Alexander Archakov's 80th Birthday and 75th Anniversary of the Institute of Biomedical Chemistry



Russian C-HPP Consortium

Since 2008, Russia has been one of the proactive participants in the Human Proteome Project, a successor to the previously completed Human Genome Program. Institute of Biomedical Chemistry (IBMC) is the leader of the Russian scientific consortium "Human Proteome of the Chromosome 18". In 2020 Russia was proposed to host the participants of the International Human Proteome Consortium at the 23rd International Symposium "FROM CHROMOSOME-CENTRIC PROJECT TO THE HUMAN PROTEOME" (C-HPP2020) to exchange experiences and discuss the results and prospects for collaboration. The event will summarize the 10-year collaboration of scientists from 24 countries.

Russia was among the first three countries (along with Korea and Canada) that initiated the preparation of the project during a workshop in Moscow in 2009. The outcome was the first published roadmap for project implementation (Archakov et al., 2009).

The decision on participation of the Russia's team in the Human Proteome Project was taken in 2010 supervised by the Prime Minister of the Russian Federation. This decision determined the leading vector of Russia's participation in large-scale collaboration. For project implementation, Russia's scientific consortium was formed, including the undisputed leaders - the Shemyakin and Ovchinnikov Institute of Bioorganic Chemistry, Engelhardt Institute of Molecular Biology (EIMB), Center for Bioengineering of the Russian Academy of Sciences, etc.


